Prepare your account



Login and familiarize yourself with your educator account.



Review your class list on the “Roster” tab to ensure they are accurate.



[Set the assignment](#) for the students you work with.



Get the materials ready



Make sure students have login information. Print [student login cards](#) if your school does not use Clever or Classlink.



Ensure each student has access to resources such as a device, pencil, headphones, and internet.



Make sure you have instructional materials on hand (e.g. Zearn Workbooks, printed [Student Notes](#)).



Engage your students



Orient students to the [flow of a digital lesson](#) by completing 2-3 Digital Lessons as a whole class.



Model getting questions wrong and discuss the importance of making and learning from mistakes.



Model using paper Student Notes during the Digital Lesson and persevering through parts that might be more challenging.



Establish classroom systems and routines



Enact systems and routines to celebrate Digital Lesson engagement. See our [anchor charts and ideas](#).



Set goals with students to encourage perseverance through struggle. See our [goal trackers and ideas](#).



Use the [Pace Report](#) to check on Zearn sign-ins, time, and lesson completion. Use the [Tower Alerts Report](#) to diagnose struggle and craft a plan to support.
